Regular meeting of the City Council
Mayor Sapsupliner in the chair upon
Roll Call the following Aldermen res.

ponded Hards Hutchinson, Mantley McGary
Shores and Waldroup. Absent Barton and
Brunnick.

Minutes of previous meetings read
and approved.

A petition was received asking
the Council to have a side walk constructed
along blocks 107 & 114.

Moved and seconded that the petition
for side walk be referred to the Street Alley Com.
to investigate. Carried

A petition was received asking
the Council to order a sidewalk along blocks
108 & 109.

Moved and seconded that the matter
of sidewalk along block 108 and 109 be referred to
the Street and Alley Committee. Carried

The monthly reports of the City
Treasurer, Police Magistrate, and Engineer were
read and upon motion referred to the Finance
Committee.

The Superintendent of Water Works
report was read and upon motion referred to
the Water Committee.

Moved and seconded that J. M. Primmy
be allowed to address the Council upon the matter
of pipe to extend over the break water at the
pumping plant. Carried

Moved and seconded that the water
Committee have power to purchase pipe to
extend into the river over the Break water.
A vote was then taken which was as follows
Hards voted yea Hutchinson yea McGary yea
Shores yea. Waldroup yea. Carried

The Supt of Water Works made
a written report upon the alleged settling
of the Kent and Allen tanks showing that
the same was not caused by the City water
mains.

The report of the Superintendent was
accepted and the City Clerk instructed to
send a copy of the same to Mr. C. E. Mitchell
at Grully, Ok.

City Attorney reported on the Raughman
and Anderson bills for damages that unless
the Plaintiff could prove a defect in the City
system of sewers that he would recommend
the disallowing of the bills.

Moved and seconded that
the report of the City Attorney be accepted
Carried

In the matter of the interest on delinquent taxes the City attorney recommended that an expert be hired to go over the County Treasurer books and see how much interest was due the City.

Moved and seconded that the matter of hiring an expert to examine into the County Treasurers books and see what amount of interest is due the City on delinquent taxes be referred to the Finance Committee with power to act. A vote was then taken which was as follows Hards voted yea Hutchinson yea Mantey yea Mc Cary yea Shores yea Waldroup yea Carried

The City attorney then presented a certificate of appointment of J.W. Becklin as deputy City Attorney which was approved by the Mayor and ratified by the City Council.

The following resolution was then introduced Be it resolved that the owner of the one story brick and adobe building situated on lot 3 block 117 has become and is now in the condition described in section 7 ordinance no 6 of said City and the same is hereby described as nuisance wherefore the City Marshal is hereby instructed to serve the notice provided for in section 8 of said ordinance no 6. A vote was then taken upon the above resolution which was as follows

Moved and seconded That the water Committee be given more time in which to make its report on the water connections Carried

The Street and Alley Committee recommended the re survey of Sec ^{and that part} 14, which had not been resurveyed and permanent monuments established

Moved and seconded That the report of the Street and Alley Committee be accepted and that Chas W. Haskell be employed to do the work of resurveying and establishing permanent monuments in City from 1 to 15 streets and from North to South Streets in Section 14 at a cost not to exceed two hundred dollars

A vote was then taken which was as follows Hards voted yea Hutchinson yea Mantey yea Mc Cary yea Shores yea Waldroup yea Carried

Alderman Hards then introduced proposed ordinance No 111 an ordinance concerning side walks on main street between third and sixth streets, The same

Resolved that the City Council of the Street & Alley Com

was then read and upon motion ordered published according to law.

Alderman Shores then introduced Proposed Ordinance No 113. "An Ordinance Concerning the Fire Department. The ordinance was then read.

Moved and seconded that Collickerson be allowed to address the Council upon the proposed ordinance carried.

Moved and seconded that the matter of salary for the two assistants in proposed ordinance No 113 be changed from \$40⁰⁰ to \$50⁰⁰ per month. A vote was then taken which was as follows. Fards voted nay. Hutchinson yea. Mauty nay. McCarry nay. Shores nay. Waldron yea. Lost.

The Clerk has then instructed to have Proposed Ordinance No 113 published according to law.

All new bills were then referred to the Finance Committee.

its final passage Ordinance No 110 being "An Ordinance to create the alley in Block No 5 of the City of Grand Junction" A vote was then taken on the adoption of the passage of the above Ordinance which was as follows Harde voted yea Hutchinson yea Mantley yea McCarry yea Spivey yea Waltroup yea. Carried
 Moved and Seconded That J. U. Billing be allowed to address the Council upon the matter of Paid Fire Department. Carried
 Moved and Seconded We adjourn until June 24 1902 at 8 P.M. Carried
