June 27 - 1903

Adjourned meeting of the City Council
Mayor Sampliner in the Chair Upon Roll Call
the following Aldermen responded Hards
Hutchinson, Mc-Cary, Shores and Waldroup.
Absent Barton, Brunnick and Mantey.

Moved and seconded We dispense with the
reading of the minutes Carried

A Petition was presented asking that a
new sidewalk be constructed from Colorado
on 5th to the River on the East side of 5th Street.

The Petition was referred to the Street
and Alley Committee

A Petition signed by J. E. Sulmain was
received asking the Council to change his
liquor license to the Riffe Place in Block 118.

Moved and seconded That the petition
of J. E. Sulmain be granted and the license
transferred a vote was then taken which
was as follows Hards voted yea Hutchinson nay
Mc-Cary yea, Shores yea, Waldroup yea. Carried

Moved and seconded That Guy Stemberg
be allowed to address the Council upon the matter
of the Street Car as a public Carrier. Carried

Moved and seconded That the controversy
over the Street Car be referred to the Street and
Alley Committee Carried

Moved and seconded Perry Rogers
be allowed to address the Council upon the matter
of selling the old fire horse Button Carried

Mrs. Rogers was informed that
the City of Grand Junction would not con-
sent to the selling of the fire horse Button.

The Street and Alley Committee

recommended that a side-walk be constructed along the south side of Road Ave along and in front of Block 109 of the City of Grand Junction.

Moved and seconded The report of the Committee be accepted Carried

The following resolution was then introduced

Whereas in the opinion of a two third majority of the City Council it is necessary that a new side-walk be constructed along and in front of the north side of Block 109 and along and in front of lots 1 to 16 inclusive on the south side of Road Ave and between 10th and 11th Streets.

Therefore be it ordered that a new side walk be constructed such as provided by ordinance save that it be six feet wide instead of twelve along and in front of the above described lots and property under the provisions of the Statutes and Ordinance in such cases made and provided
