on the east side of of South 5th Street. Also a
12 foot Stone, ~~to~~ concrete or cement side walk along
and in front of lots 18 to 21 inclusive in Block 102
on the North side of Main Street between 3" + 4" streets all
In the City of Grand Junction Mesa No Colorado.
