Erect Light  
Plant for City

The City Attorney then reported that he had drafted an ordinance the heading <sup>which was introduced by Alderman Hutchinson</sup> was as follows: "An Ordinance to authorize the erection and construction by the City of Grand Junction of a City Electric Light works for lighting, heating and power purposes for said ~~city~~ <sup>city</sup> and its inhabitants, to be forever owned, managed and operated by said City, and to contract an Indebtedness on behalf

of the City for such purpose by the issuance of its bonds in the sum of \$28,000. And to submit to all voters of said City, who are tax payers under the law, at the general election to be held on the First Tuesday of April 1903, the question of the authorization and construction of the said Electric Light works and the issuance of said bonds.

Proposed City Light plant Ordinance Ordinal Published

After the reading of the proposed ordinance a motion was made and duly seconded that the report be accepted and the proposed ordinance published according to law.
