the cost of water pipe to replace the present one now on the bridge and the cost of the creation of an electric light plant. made the following report.

That 3 in riveted iron pipe <sup>flanged ends</sup> could be bought for from \$1.20 per foot \$1.42 per foot. The committee further reported that an electric light plant could be constructed, <sup>yearly</sup> double the capacity of the present one except the building, which would be of corrugated iron instead of brick for from \$27,874.<sup>00</sup> to \$31,446.<sup>00</sup> complete with every detail. The committee also submitted cuts of the proposed dynamo, engine and boilers.

Light Ordinance

Alderman Hutchinson then introduced Ordinance No 115 and moved its adoption which was seconded by Alderman McCarry. Ordinance No 115 being an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to authorize the erection and construction by the City of Grand Junction of a City Electric Light works for lighting, heating and power purposes for said city and its inhabitants, to be forever owned, managed and operated by said city, and to contract an indebtedness on behalf of the city for such purpose by the issuance of its bonds in the sum of \$28,000, and to submit to all the voters of said city who are tax payers under the law, at the general election to be held on the first Tuesday of April, 1903, the question of the authorization and construction of the said Electric Light works and the issuance of said bonds.

a vote was then taken upon the passage and adoption of Ordinance No 115 as read which was as follows. Brumick voted yea, Harbo, yea, Hutchinson, yea, Mantey, yea, McLeary yea, Spores yea. Carried
