McCaun of Denver submitting <sup>three</sup> propositions for a light plant to cost from 27,834<sup>00</sup> to 31,446<sup>00</sup> same to have a voltage of 2200 and nearly double <sup>the capacity</sup> of the present plant. Whereas in the opinion of a two-thirds majority of the City Council it is necessary that a side walk be constructed along and in front of lots 1 to 16 in Block 129 and 1 to 16 Bk 130 on the South side of Colorado Ave and along and in front of lots 29 to 30 in Block 105 on the North side of Main Street bet 6" + 7" and along and in front of lots 1 to 11 in Block 116 on the South side of Main Street between 6" + 7"

Therefore. Be it resolved that a new side walk be constructed along and in front of the above described lots on Colo Ave save that it be 6 feet wide instead of 12 and that the side walk on main street be 12 feet such as is provided by Ordinance under the Statute and Ordinances in such cases made and provided
