Minutes of two previous meetings



read and approved

Mayor Saupling Chairman of the Water and Sewer Committee reported unfavorable upon the matter of allowing the Indian School to turn its sewerage into the Grand River above the Smelter

Moved and seconded that the report of the Water and Sewer Committee be accepted. Carried

A Petition for the extension of water mains in Mobley Addition was received. Signed by G W Yates and others. The same was read and upon motion duly seconded was laid over for the new Council.

The following resolution was then introduced

Whereas in opinion of a two thirds Majority of the property owners and the City Council it is necessary that a new side walk be constructed along and in front of lots 1 to 16 in Block 145 on Pitkin Ave between 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Streets.

Therefore be it resolved that a new side walk be constructed along and in front of the above described lots on Pitkin Avenue some that it be 6 feet wide instead of 12 such as is provided by Ordinance in such Cases made and provided. A vote was then taken which was as follows Brumick voted yea Harbo yea Mantey yea McCary yea Shaws yea Waldroup yea Carried

A communication signed by John Newman was received relating to the settling of his residence caused by the sewer being stoped in the rear of his premises and flooding his cellar

The communication was upon motion laid over for the new Council

The City Clerk was instructed to receive \$81 tendered by R J Bolls as side walk assessment and turn the same over to the County treasure

A written report and plat of the opening up of a certain Street in Crawford's Addition was submitted by Engineer Haskell.

The same was upon motion referred to the new Council.

The matter of liquor license for the coming year was upon motion duly seconded referred to the new Council.

The Special Committee appointed to investigate into the safety of the stand pipe reported "That they would recommend that stand pipe be removed as they considered the same dangerous as it was out of plumb some eight inches

Moved and seconded that the report of the Committee be accepted and that the stand pipe be removed. A vote was then taken which was

Ordinance No 118 was <sup>introduced by Alderman McCary who moved it</sup> ~~then~~ placed upon its final passage and adoption Ordinance No 118 being "An Ordinance to amend Section 2 of Ordinance No 96, being an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Sewers" Passed and adopted on the 18th day of July A.D. 1900.

A vote was then taken on the passage and adoption of the above and foregoing ordinance which was as follows. Brummick voted yea Hards yea Hutchinson yea Mantey yea McCary yea Shores yea Waldroup yea Carried

Ordinance No 119 was then introduced by Alderman Mantey and moved its adoption Ordinance No 119 being "An Ordinance Concerning Privies, Water Closets, and Urinals" A vote was then taken upon the passage and adoption of Ordinance No 119 which was as follows

Moved and seconded That the Street Supervisor remove the street car track and then proceed to place the
