Grand Jct Colo Apr 20 1903

First meeting of the City Council Mayor
Sampliner in the chair - whereupon the following Aldermen who
had qualified responded - Buckins, Hards, ^{Nelson} Merril, ^{Walter} Rader,
^{Maurice} Ramsey, ^{John} Smith, ^{John} Stockton, ^{Samuel} Waldroup.

City Clerk Ketchum and City Atty Staley occupied their respective
seats until the Official Bond of Frank G. Leslie and J. S. Carnahan ^{city attorney}
were approved and accepted by the Council whereupon they each assumed their duties.
The following Committees were then appointed by the mayor and approved
by the Council -

 The name of J.B. Hards was then placed in nomination for the office
 of City Physician. There being no other nomination a motion
 prevailed that the Clerk be instructed to cast the ballot for J.B. Hards
 for the Council as City Physician, whereupon the Clerk cast the
 ballot and Mr. J.B. Hards was declared elected,

Day Pumpman A motion then prevailed that the Day pumpman retain his position
 until the first of May 1903, also a motion prevailed that the
 entire Fire Department retain their respective positions until
 May 1st 1903.

On Motion E.A. Krohn was allowed to address the Council on the
 right to move a sheet iron building within the fire limits
 to another within the fire limits and erect a brick building in
 its stead - was referred to the Fire & Police Committee -
 The application for Liquor license of the following firms were

 The matter of purchasing water for the ditches was referred
 to the Purchasing Committee, with full power to act upon the

 between 2nd and 3rd Street was presented whereupon the

Report of Sup't of Waterworks ^{for the year ending March 31, 1903}, was read and ordered
placed on file.

Motion made and seconded that ^{for the publication of the same} The Daily Sentinel be
made the official paper of the City of Grand Jct.
Motion amended to lay on the table which recited as
follows: On amendment: Buckins voted nay, Hards nay,
Merrill yea, Rader nay, Ramsey yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea
Waldroup May, the vote Mayor Sampson's name was called and
he voted May, ~~the~~ amendment lost.

Vote on the original motion was then called resulting as
follows: Buckins voted yea, Hards yea, Merrill May, Rader yea
Ramsey May, Smith May, Stockton May, Waldroup yea, the vote
Mayor Sampson was called and voted yea, Carried -

On Motion Mr A.W. Newman was allowed to address the
Council concerning job work, and the opinion prevails

evening Apr 21 '03 at 8 o'clock P.M. Carried.
