 passenger traffic in and about the city, the matter was

 City Atty taken in the matter

Mr Carnahan advised that as the automobile was fast becoming
 a general means of travel, that it would be impossible to
 grant an exclusive franchise, but advised that it was his
 opinion that the Council could fix a license, the matter
 of license was taken under advisement.

Ramey's
Resolution

Alderman Ramey introduced a resolution relating to the enforcement of closing of Saloons on Sunday and at Midnight also the enforcement of the Gambling ordinance and other offences and moved its adoption, which called forth some argument,

Merrill's
Resolution

The motion not being seconded, Alderman Merrill then introduced a resolution relative to the enforcement of Gambling and closing of the Saloons according to ordinance and moved its adoption, which was seconded by Ramey.

A motion was then made and seconded to lay the resolution of Mr Merrill on the table and being duly put by the Chair Carried Alderman Smith then spoke of the Flag pole in the City park having been blown down and recommended it be re-set and there being no objection was referred to the Street & Alley Com
