Adjourned meeting of the City Council, Mayor Sampson in the Chair, whereupon the following Aldermen responded to Roll Call - Hards, Merrill, Rader, Ramey, Smith, Stockton and Waldroup - Bucknis absent -

Petitions

The petition of Minnie Rogers to move a frame building from lot 22 Bek. 123 across the alley to the rear of lot 10 Bek. 123, being outside the fire limits into the fire limits, was on motion duly seconded & put rejected - Hards voted yea, Merrill yea, Rader yea, Ramey yea, Smith yea, Stockton nay, Waldroup yea.

Seab Labor

A resolution was presented by J. U. Harris et al, a committee from the Trades Assembly, asking that the Council rescind their action of contracting for coal with the Utah Fuel Co for the reason that that company employed Seab labor.

This resolution called forth quite a spirited discussion, The Committee were notified that as the contract had been signed by both parties to it, that for the present the Council had no power to act in the matter.

Expressmen
Permit

An exclusive permit signed by J. E. DuLaine, giving permission to H. E. Grubbs & W. H. Burkhardt Expressmen, to stand in front of his place of business on the Cor of 4th & Main streets, was on motion duly seconded and put referred to the Street & Alley Committee.

A resolution to increase the salary of Street laborers, ditch diggers etc from \$1.75 per day to \$2.00 per day was introduced by Wm Stockton who moved its adoption and being seconded a vote was then taken resulting as follows, Hards voted Nay, Merrill yea, Rader Nay - Ramey Nay, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea, Carried, The City Atty was instructed to draft an ordinance concerning the same for the approval of the Council.

Reports of Committees - The Water & Sewer Committee

reported in favor of hiring Geo R Barton to investigate different filter systems throughout the state and report on the most feasible plan, and on motion to accept the report of the committee and hire Mr Barton a vote was taken as follows: Harbo voted yea, Merrill may, Rader yea, Ramey yea, Smith may, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea. Sidewalks

The Street & Alley Committee reported sidewalks on 3^d 4th 5th & 6th Streets in bad repair and recommended a 6 ft side walk be laid from the Alley back of Main Street on the East side of 4th Street to Grand Ave and on motion duly seconded and put the following resolution was adopted: Whereas in the opinion of the City Council it is necessary that a new sidewalk be constructed along the East side of 4th Street from the Alley back of Main Street north to Grand Avenue, Therefore be it resolved that a new sidewalk be constructed along and in front of said blocks and that the same be 6 ft wide instead of 12 ft such as provided by Ordinance in such case made and provided.
