Adjourned meeting of the City Council President of the Council Hards Mayor Pro tem in the Chair:

The following aldermen responded to roll call Merrill, Rader, Ramey, Smith and Stockton, The following were absent, Buckins, Waldroup, and Mayor Sampliner - Minutes of June 23 1903 and July 14 1903 read and approved

The petition of Lizzie M Harris et al to abate the nuisance of the junk yard of G L Antlaw was upon motion referred to the Health, Fire & Police Committee.

The petition of The Grand Jet Lbr Co for permission to put in a switch that will cross the old county road between main & Col on to their yard - was on motion ^{duely seconded} ~~referred to the~~ and put to allow the switch to be put in by signing contract to be drawn by the city atty and approved by the council vote being taken was as follows Merrill voted yea, Rader yea, Ramey yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea carried.

A resolution was presented from the I.O.O.F. & A.F. & A.M. as follows:

Whereas, Mesa Lodge Lodge No 55, A.F. & A.M. and Mesa Lodge No 58 I.O.O.F. are desirous of connecting with the water mains of the City of Grand Junction to supply water for the sprinkling of lawns and parks and irrigation of trees in the cemeteries owned by said orders on Orchard Mesa, and

Whereas, the improvements sought to be done by said Orders are in the nature of public improvements and the beautifying of the resting place of the dead, and

Whereas such improvements are not for the purpose of private gain to any extent, Therefore be it Resolved, that the City of Grand Junction does hereby grant to said Orders the privilege of tapping its water main at or near the east line of the Masonic Cemetery

with two $\frac{3}{4}$ inch taps and that they be permitted the use of water from said main for the purposes aforesaid subject to the rules and regulations now existing, or may be hereafter adopted, for the tapping of mains and the use of water, at a rate not to exceed one cent per thousand gallons, and be it further

Resolved, that no revocation of this resolution shall ever be made by this or subsequent boards of Councilmen without first giving sixty days notice to the said Orders.
