

Grand Junction Sept 1st 1903

Adjourned Special meeting of the City Council Mayor Sampson in the chair - The following aldermen responded to roll call Buckins, Hards, Merrill, Ramey, Stockton, Waldroup, those absent were Rader and Smith.

Motion made seconded and put to order sidewalk on South side South Street between 5th Street and 7th Street and the following resolution was adopted as shown by the vote taken:

Sidewalk Whereas, in the opinion of a two thirds majority of the City Council it is necessary that a new sidewalk be constructed along the South side of South Street between 5th and 7th Streets:

Therefore be it resolved that a new sidewalk be constructed along and in front of said blocks and that the same be six feet wide instead of 12 feet such as provided by ordinance in such case made and provided:

Sidewalk A Sidewalk petition from the School board of School District No 1 was received asking for various new sidewalks leading to the new School building, which was referred to the street & Alley Committee -

Unfavorable as to Van Hoorbelle Sidewalk The Street and Alley Committee reported unfavorable in the matter of allowing Mr Van Hoorbelle to build a four foot sidewalk on 10th to the alley south of main and recommended that it be made 6 feet wide:
