New Sidewalks

A communication from Street Supervisor Armstrong was presented suggesting that a new sidewalk be laid on both sides of Main Street from 4th to 5th Streets and also in front of the property occupied by The Mesadry Goods Company and M Strouse on main street between 3rd & 4th Streets - Same to be either Concrete or Flagging Whereupon the following resolution was introduced Whereas, in the opinion of the two thirds majority of the City Council it is necessary that a new sidewalk be constructed along both sides of Main Street from 4th to 5th Streets the same being all the lots on the south side of Block 103 and also the north side of Block 118 also in front of lots 11 & 12 Block 119 -

Therefore be it resolved that a new sidewalk be constructed along and in front of said Lot and Block and that the same be 12 feet wide either of concrete or flagging, such as provided by ordinance in such case made and provided -
