Regular meeting of the City Council, Mayor Sampson
in the chair -

to Construct a building on Rood Street where the Lumsden Stone Crusher now stands, constructed with concrete foundation and veneered with brick the same not wholly conforming to the construction ordinances, was referred to the Fire & Police Committee -

Mr Franklin Butler stated to the Council that he had erected a tent within the fire limits for the storage of some of his furniture, and asked for the same to be allowed to stand, - The matter was referred to the City Atty

A large delegation, probably 25 to 30 people, residents of the fourth ward was present, they stated that it was their understanding that the Stone Crusher was to be erected on South Street between 5th + 6th streets and stated if this be true they wished to enter a protest,

Whereupon the following resolution was introduced by Alderman Smith who moved its adoption -

Whereas, that certain Rock crusher heretofore erected on Rood Ave between 3rd + 4th streets has been declared a nuisance and ordered abated, and,

Whereas, it has been represented to the City Council that the same is to be erected on South Street between 5th + 6th streets, and,

Whereas, the residents of the last named district have objected to the Council, and protested against the erection of the same in said vicinity,

Therefore, be it Resolved by the City Council that J. J. Lumsden be notified not to erect said Rock Crusher at said location nor at any other location in this City, where the same will be an annoyance or nuisance to the inhabitants of this City, and that a copy of this resolution be sent to him -
