

Grand Junction Colo Nov 14 1903

Adjourned regular meeting of the City Council Mayor Sampson in the chair, The following aldermen responded to roll call: Buckins, Hards, Merrill, Rader, Ramey, Smith, & Stockton, Alderman Waldroup was a few minutes tardy:

Sidewalk

Mr B F Jay stated that the sidewalks along the South side of Blocks 82 and 83 were in bad repair, there being a great many boards missing, and suggested that the Street Supervisor be instructed to see that they were repaired; and on motion the Street Supervisor was instructed to notify the property owners on the South side of Blocks 82 and 83 and also Lot 13 Block 122 all in the City of Grand Junction, to Repair said sidewalks within 10 days or a new six foot sidewalk would be

ordered laid-

Sidewalk

It was reported by Alderman Rader that a new sidewalk was needed from Main Street to White on the West side of Second Street whereupon the following resolution was presented by Mr Rader who moved its adoption -

Whereas, in the opinion of a two thirds majority of the City Council it is necessary that a new sidewalk be constructed along the West side of 2d Street from Main to White Streets, the same being along the east side of lots 12 + 13 Block 99 and lots 12 + 13 Block 100 in the City of Grand Junction,

Therefore be it resolved that a new sidewalk be constructed along said lots and Blocks and that the same be six feet wide instead of 12 feet, such as provided by ordinance, in such case made and provided, being second a vote was taken as follows

Supt of Construction B.W. Vedder's report as the expense of work done at the reservoirs was read in detail accepted and ordered placed on file.

The City attorney advised to raise the rates of water after Jan 1st 1904, taken under advisement -

The Water Committee recommended to send Supt Vedder to investigate the pump proposition at Leadville and report at next regular meeting and on motion this report was accepted by the following vote: Buckins voted yea, Harde yea, Merrill yea, Rader yea, Ramey yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea,

The fire + Police Committee reported in favor of McDevilles petition to erect a barn covered with corrugated iron in the rear of his residence on Colo Ave between 5th + 6th Streets On motion their report was accepted by the following

ORDINANCE NO. 123.

An Ordinance in Relation to Spitting on Sidewalks, Stairs and Other Public Walks.

A proposal Ordinance introduced by Alderman Hards.

Be It ordained by the city council of the city of Grand Junction.

Section I: That spitting upon side walks, stairs and other public walks within the city of Grand Junction is hereby declared to be a nuisance and from and after the passage of this Ordinance, no person shall spit upon any of the public sidewalks within this city nor upon any or in any stair way contained in any office building or public building within this city.

Section II: Any person violating the provisions of Section One of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of an offense and upon conviction shall be fined not less than \$5 nor more than \$100.
