To the Honorable Mayor and City Council of the City of Grand Junction,
Ariz: In relation to the claim of Mr. and Mrs. Blake
for alleged injuries received by Mrs Blake on or about the 28th day
of July, 1904, I have to say, that I have investigated the facts
with the committee to some considerable extent and I think that there
are legal technicalities that might and probably would defeat
the claim, entirely, in the event of a suit by them against the City,
and without recognizing any liability on the part of the City in this
case I would suggest, in as much as she has been unfortunate
in the affair, that if the claim can be settled by the payment of
a small amount of money, it might be advisable to do so.

Motion prevailed to instruct the Marshall to notify the Druggists to keep a record of all intoxicants sold and also to notify M Hertz not to sell liquors in quantities less than one gallon -

Motion prevailed that the City attorney be instructed to draft an ordinance regulating the sale of intoxicating liquors by Drug stores and Wholesale Liquor houses -

The application, ^{and bond} of Maurice Hertz as principal and AR Sampson and Orson Adams Jr as sureties in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars, to keep a Wholesale liquor store at No. 348 and 352 Colo Ave. with authority to sell therein Spirituous, Vinous and Malt Liquors in quantities of one gallon and over was presented; Motion made seconded and put to grant license and approve the bond; Harbo voted yea, Merrill May, Rader yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea - Carried -

Adjournment was then taken until Wednesday April 20 1904 at 8 P.M.
