

Grand Junction Colo May 3^d 1904

Adjourned meeting of the city council Mayor Sampliner in the chair; The following aldermen responded to roll call, Harbo, Merrill Ramey, Rader, Smith, ~~Stockton~~, Waldroup, Aldermen Buckins and Stockton absent.

Waste Water

The petition of G Carpenter and others asking that some disposition of the waste water on West Grand Ave, be made was referred to the Street & Alley Committee.

Special Police

The petitions of A J Wharton and James Beshere to be appointed as special night police was ordered placed on file.

Liquor License

The application and Bond of T D Reames asking that License heretofore granted the Grand Junction Liquor Company be transferred to them to sell liquors at Lots 17 & 18 Block 119 city of Grand Junction, ^{from May 3^d 1904 to Oct 17th 1904} Their bondsmen were T D Reames, J B Sullivan, A K Sampliner and M Harty in the sum of \$2000⁰⁰

Motion made seconded and put to allow such transfer of license and approve the bond Harbo voted yea, Merrill nay, Ramey excused from voting, Rader yea, Smith yea, Waldroup yea carried.

Blake Case Settled

The Committee appointed to look into the merits of the alleged injuries to Mrs Katherine Blake reported that a verbal agreement had been made that Mrs Blake would sign a release to the city on payment to her of \$600⁰⁰ and presented a form of agreement for the approval of Council Motion made seconded and put to accept the report of the Committee, Harbo voted yea, Merrill yea, Ramey yea, Rader yea, Smith yea, Waldroup yea carried.

E M Spencer Ditch water

Everett M Spencer presented the following application
To the Hon Mayor & City Council of the City of Grand Junction Colo: Sirs

Spencer use of Ditch

I hereby apply to the City Council for permission to use the City Ditch down to a point near lot or tract No 9 Capitol Hill subdivision for the carriage of six (6) inches of water and to place in said Ditch a box for the diversion of said 6 inches of water near said land. I agree that I will not interfere with the use of the ditch by the city nor divert any of the water intended for the city and that I shall not acquire any right to the use of said Ditch beyond the present irrigating season and that at the end of this season all my right to use the same shall cease and determine and that the expense

of placing diverting box in said ditch shall be born by me.

On motion the marshal was instructed to notify Wm Nishwitz to take down the wire fence erected by him along 2d & 4th streets -
