Regular meeting of the City Council Mayor Sampson in the chair: The following aldermen responded to Roll Call Hards Ramey, Rader, Smith, Stockton, Aldermen Buckins and Merrill were absent - Alderman Waldroup a few minutes tardy -

Mr Caldwell living on the west side N 7<sup>th</sup> Street has planted shade trees along the street in front of his residence and asked Council to allow the fence erected by him, to protect the trees, to stand - Motion made seconded and put to allow the fence to stand when proper contract is drawn and signed Hards voted nay, Ramey yea, Rader nay, Smith nay, Stockton yea Waldroup nay - motion lost -

The matter was then referred to the Street & Alley Committee Report of Standing Committees - The Street & Alley committee

reported that they had been unable to solve the problem of draining the Slough on West Grand Avenue and suggested that the Street Supervisor and City attorney be added to the Committee with power to act, which was done -

The Finance committee recommended that City Treasurer O B Rich be released from the payment of \$150<sup>00</sup> being the amount tied up in the defunct Colo State Bank

Motion made seconded and put that the city attorney be instructed to draw up a contract under the conditions of the bid and instruct the Mayor and Clerk to sign said contract Hards voted yea, Ramey yea, Rader yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea, carried.

Ord # 125

Alderman Waldroup introduced Ordinance No 125 -

An Ordinance to provide for the issuance of a license for the sale of Spirits, Veneer and Malt Liquors in Original packages or Bottles, which was read at length, <sup>and considered</sup> before the council -

Motion that Ordinance No 125 be published in the Daily Sentinel, a legal publication, one issue, being seconded the vote was as follows. Hands voted yea, Ramey may, Rader yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea Waldroup yea - Carried

Motion made seconded and put that the city building be constructed at the corner of 6<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Ave and that the contract be awarded to W C Boyer on his bid for \$3363<sup>76</sup> also that he be required to give a good and sufficient bond to be approved by the City Council, in the sum of \$2500<sup>00</sup>

Hands voted yea, Ramey may, Rader yea, Smith may, Stockton may Waldroup yea, Tie vote, Mayor Sampson's name was then called He voting yea - Carried

Badges

Motion made seconded and put that the Aldermen and Mayor be furnished with suitable badges designating the office and ward so they might be able to do police duty, and that the Clerk be instructed to get prices and samples, Hands voted yea, Ramey may, Rader yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea, Carried

Vedder

Set Pump

Motion made seconded and put that B W Vedder be employed to set up the new pump at \$125<sup>00</sup> per month and that Mrs H L Lucie be appointed deputy Clerk at a salary of 50<sup>00</sup> per month also that Frank Lucie be employed as Supt of Water Works at a salary of 100<sup>00</sup> per month, simply for the time required to



erect the pump and put it in operation, Harbo voted yea,

Motion made seconded and put that the matter of seepage from  
the city ditch along the Enterprise be referred to the Street & Alley  
Committee with power to act. Harbo voted yea, Ramey yea, Rader
