

Grand Junction Colo., May 24 1904
from regular meeting of May 10th 1904

Adjourned ^{regular} meeting of the City Council, Mayor Sampson in the chair; The following Aldermen responded to Roll Call Hards, Merrill, Ramey, Rader, Smith, Stockton and Waldroup Minutes of May 10th 1904 read and approved.

The city attorney reported on the Citizens Gas & Coke Co's franchise, which was ordered placed on file -

On motion Mr Orson Adams Jr was allowed to address the council, Mr Adams presented a form of contract to furnish arc lights to the city for 10 years -

The contract was referred to the committee together with the City Attorney, report to be made at next regular meeting. A Communication from ^{Special} Health officer Haskell was read and ordered placed on file -

The matter of purchasing badges for the Mayor and Aldermen was referred to W C Stockton with power to act. On motion, all who wished to address the council on the Gas and Coke Franchise Ordinance were given that privilege, Quite a heated argument ensued, Mr Edwards, Geo Smith, E M Slocomb, A B Hutchinson and the Mayor made talks,

Motion made seconded and put to allow the Ordinance printed in the official paper, ^{one reading} The Ordinance having been previously read at length and considered by the city council

Hards voted nay, Merrill yea, Ramey yea, Rader yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup nay, Carried -

Mr R H Sullivan requested that a new street crossing be put in at 9th & Road streets. The same had been ordered by the Street & Alley Committee, No further action ^{necessary}

Motion made seconded and put that cement walks in residents portion, unless otherwise specified, shall be 5 feet in width carried -

Motion that warrant for \$10⁰⁰ drawn in favor of H S Bedwell for pasturing the horse "Charlie" be cancelled and that Bedwell be given the horse for the Bill -

Hards voted yea, Merrill nay, Ramey nay, Rader nay, Smith yea, Stockton nay, Waldroup yea, Motion lost

On motion council adjourned
