The reports of City Weigher, Police Magistrate, and City Treasurer were read and referred to the finance committee - The Committee on lights submitted a report in writing and was in substance to the effect that the city ~~put in~~ secure 100 - 32 CP incandescant lights to be placed where designated by the city council for which they will pay \$1.75 per month and also that the meter rate on all city buildings shall be 10 cents per 1000 watts -

Ordinance Gas Franchise

The petition of J M Diehl and others requesting that an electric light be placed in the center of the cross streets at the corner of 6th & Patton, the citizens to pay the additional expense of having it placed in the center of the street instead of the usual manner, was ordered placed on file -

The Gas franchise Ordinance was then taken up and the opinion of the City attorney read at length - which was, that the question of granting a franchise to the Gas & Coke company, should be submitted to the qualified voters of the city -

After some discussion ~~an~~ <sup>amendment to the</sup> Ordinance was submitted by attorney Rhone, and the matter was taken under advisement until the next meeting -
