

Grand Jet Colo June 24 1908

Adjourned meeting of the city council Mayor Jamplin in the chair, the following alderman responded to Roll call Buckins, Harbo, Merrill, Rader, Smith Stockton and Waldroup - Alderman Ramey absent -

Minutes of June 14th and June 21 1908 read and approved Mr B J Smider was present and asked council to devise ways and means by which the Sweet Clover pest might be exterminated - Mr Smider was informed that the Street supervisor was now testing the ability of a weed killer and should it be a success, it would be used on the Sweet Clover all over the city -

The Street Supervisor was instructed to notify all property ~~to~~ owners to cut weeds, and clean up their property -

The gas franchise Ordinance, ^{no 126} was then taken up and read at length and discussed, ^{amended} and adopted by sections - ^{Section 1 + 2 according to last reading - Section 3 adopted as originally read} so Section 4 was added that ^{to any and all consumers desiring the same on order of the city Council provided it be} The Company shall extend their pipe lines, on application of ^{or user} ~~the~~ consumer on ~~one~~ ^{one} block, for each block of extension required

and also that said company shall not interfere with trees or shrubbery, in laying their pipes -

Motion made seconded and put to adopt the entire Ordinance #126 and that the same be published one issue in the Daily Sentinel, a legal publication, and that the said The Citizens Gas and Coke Company shall bear all the expenses connected therewith. Buckins voted yea Hards yea, Merrill yea Rader yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea, Carried

A proposed ordinance was then introduced by Alderman Merrill, entitled "An Ordinance for the calling and holding of a Special Election to submit to the taxpayers of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, for approval or rejection of the Ordinance granting a franchise to 'The Citizens Gas and Coke Company'" It was taken up, considered and read at length before the City Council and motion made seconded and put that the said ordinance be published in the 'Daily Sentinel' a legal publication, one issue - Buckins voted yea, Hards yea, Merrill yea, Rader yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea Carried -

Ordinance No 125 "an ordinance to Provide for the issuance of a License for the sale of Aperituous, Vinaceous and Malt Liquors in Original packages or bottles," was taken up on final reading, read at length and considered by the city council -

Motion made seconded and put that Ordinance No. 125 be passed and adopted and that the same be published in The Daily Sentinel a legal publication, one issue - Buckins voted yea, Hards yea, Merrill yea, Rader yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea, - carried -

A communication was received from the Grd Jet Elec & Gas Co stating that they would present a proposition at

A proposed ordinance was presented by Alderman Waldroup, entitled "An Ordinance repealing Sections 7-8-9+10 of Article 6 of Ordinance No 83, passed and approved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction June 30th 1899 - The same was read at length and considered by the city Council and a motion made seconded and put to publish said ordinance one issue in "The Daily Sentinel" a legal publication - Buckins voted yea, Hards Nay, Merrill Nay, Rader yea, Smith Nay, Stocketon yea, Waldroup yea, Motion declared lost by the Mayor, as it requires a majority of the Council elected to change or pass an Ordinance -

The following resolution was introduced by Alderman Hards -

Resolution

Be it Resolved By the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that Bostwick W. Vedder, the duly appointed, qualified and acting Superintendent of Water Works of the City of Grand Junction, and ex-officio Superintendent of Sewers of said city, be and is hereby authorized to receive the one hundred dollars due to the City of Grand Junction from Thos. G. Lemmon, U.S. Indian Agent, in full of account for the payment due in the year 1904 upon the contract between the City of Grand Junction and the said Thos. G. Lemmon, U.S. Indian Agent, for the continuous and ample right of way for the passage of the sewer of the Indian School at Grand Junction through the sewers of the City of Grand Junction.

And that the said Bostwick W. Vedder be and is hereby authorized to sign all necessary receipts, vouchers or other papers pertaining to the collections of said one hundred dollars in full satisfaction thereof.

Motion made seconded and put, to adopt the foregoing resolution vote being taken the motion carried -

The bill of the Sandlaw-Dunn-Gordon company for the first and second installment on the pump less the freight amounting to \$1700⁹⁸ was presented - Motion made seconded and put to allow the foregoing bill and draw a warrant on the water fund for the amount - Buckins voted yea, Hards yea, Merrill Nay, Rader yea, Smith yea, Stocketon yea, Waldroup yea carried -
