Be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that there be and hereby is created a fund to be known as "The Special Sewer Fund", and the City Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to open an account with said fund and to place to the credit of said fund, monies as directed and to pay out of said fund such warrants as may be drawn thereon -

Motion made seconded and put to grant to Blair and McKenzie a Plumbers license and to approve the said Bond - Buckins Voted yea, Hards yea, Merrill yea Rader yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea Waldroup yea, Carried.

The Marshal was instructed to Notify the owners or Lessees of the Pacific Saloon to connect with the sewer within forty eight hours from the time of service of said notice, and at the expiration of said 48 hours the same is hereby declared to be a nuisance and legal action taken to abate it -

Motion made seconded and put that the Marshal notify Mrs Howard Lee owner of the property at the corner of 4th and Patton - viz Lots 16 + 17 Block 146 also that property on Road between 6th + 7th owned by S D Croys both parties of which M O Delaplain is agent, to connect said property with the sewers of the city within Ten (10) days from the service of said notice and on failure to connect within the specified time the same shall ^{and is hereby} each ~~be~~ declared to be a nuisance and legal action shall be taken to abate them - Buckins Voted yea, Hards yea, Merrill yea, Rader yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea, Carried -
