Regular meeting of the city Council, Mayor Acup-lines
 in the chair, the following Aldermen responded to Roll Call
 Buckius, Hards, Rader, Ramey, Smith, Stockton, Alderman
 Waldroup a few minutes tardy - Alderman Merrill absent -
 WS Minutes of July 12th - 19th and 26th ¹⁹⁰⁴ read and approved
 WS Core was present and petitioned Council for the extension
 of the water main from 11th & 12th street on Road avenue and
 stated that he would pay the interest on the investment -
 Motion made seconded and put to make the extension under the
 above agreement: Buckius voted yea, Hards yea, Rader yea

Peter Smith was given the privilege of addressing the Council
 He set forth at some length just how he was injured on or
 about June 20 1903, and as his case had heretofore been
 referred to the Council and rejected, he asked that a special
 Committee be appointed to investigate the merits of the same
 for a reconsideration - A Motion prevailed that the Mayor appoint
 a Committee including the City Attorney to investigate -
 Whereupon the Mayor appointed Aldermen, Ramey,
 Stockton and Waldroup together with Attorney Carnahan -

 Whereupon the Mayor notified Mr Fuits that said
 Commission would be issued upon his filing an
 approved official bond in the sum of Five hundred
 Dollars -

A communication was received from A D Croy who is the owner of a house at 635 Road ave, asking for additional time in which to connect with the sewer - As the property had been vacated and the closet torn down - No action was necessary -
