A Communication was received from H J De Long, stating that he had been notified to attach three properties to the Sewer viz: 126 Wte - 128 Wte and 522 Colo Ave, and stating also that at the first two places mentioned there is no outbuilding, or nuisance whatever on the premises - and that at 522 Colo Ave he had ordered that the outbuilding be closed and the Vault filled thus abating the nuisance - Referred to Water & Sewer Committee: There was a doubt in the minds of some of the Council, and a motion was made seconded and put the H J De Long, be required to abate the nuisance at the first two named places, at once - Motion Carried -

A motion prevailed to allow all who wished to address the Council - Dr Fisher Secretary of the Fruit Fair association requested Council to build sidewalks or cinder walks to the fair grounds, also to grade the roads, He also presented a petition numerously signed asking Council to furnish water free of charge for the use of the Fair association - Also Dr Fisher asked that the Saloons be allowed to keep open all night during the fair - The sidewalk and road question was referred to the Street & Alley Committee - No action taken on the other matters -

Scavenger Ordinance

The Scavenger Ordinance was not brought up for final passage, it appearing to the Council that the expressmen of the city had objections to parts of the Ordinance, a Motion prevailed that the mayor appoint a committee of three to confer with the expressmen regarding their objections. Whereupon the mayor appointed Aldermen Rader, Smith and Ramey to compose said Committee -

Street Railway Ordinance Geo Smith Franchise First Readings

Alderman Rader presented an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance granting a franchise for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a Street Railway and right of way to George Smith, his associates successors and assigns" which was read at length and considered by the city Council. Motion made seconded and put that said ordinance be published one issue in the Daily Sentinel, a legal publication, at the expense of the said George Smith, his associates, successors and assigns: Hards voted yea, Merrill yea, Rader yea, Ramey yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea Carried -

Furnish Hall

Motion made seconded and put that the Building Committee

be given full power to act and are hereby instructed and directed to furnish the new city building with suitable furniture -
