

Grand Junction Colo October 11th 1904

Regular meeting of the city Council President of the Council Hards in the Chair - The following Alderman responded to roll call Buckins, Hards, Rader, Ramey and Smith Alderman Merrill, Stockton, Waldroup and Mayor Sampson were absent. The minutes of September 13-27 and 29 '1904 were read and approved -

A communication was read from Theo G Lemmon Supt of the Indian School in which he made a proposition to the city to exchange the 600 feet of pipe now connected to the city water line along Main street between eleventh and twelfth streets which the Indian School owns, for 600 feet of four inch pipe - Referred to Water & Sewer Committee -

The privilege of addressing the council was given to all who wished - Leslie Campbell presented a communication from H. J. DeLong as agent for Arnon Clarke asking the privilege to erect a corrugated Iron or Bricked tin building 14 X 20 adjoining and communicating with said brick building as the present frame addition does - Motion made seconded and put to grant the permission provided no wood is exposed - Buckins voted yea, Hards yea, Rader yea, Ramey yea, Smith yea, carried - Mr Burnett proprietor of the Grand Hotel asked the privilege of erecting an ornamental porch 10 X 12 in front of the entrance to the Hotel. Motion made seconded and put to grant the privilege, Buckins voted yea, Hards yea, Rader yea, Ramey yea, Smith yea carried -

A communication was received from Max Buehrmann Cashier of the Grand Valley National Bank requesting that something be done to drain the water from the east side
