

Grand Junction Colo Nov 15 1904

Adjourned regular meeting of the City Council Mayor
Samphires in the chair, The following Aldermen responded
to roll call, Hards, Merrill, Rader, Ramey, Smith
Aldermen Buckius, Stockton and Waldroup, absent
Minutes of October 18th and November 8th 1904 read
and approved -

A petition was presented by A R Vailes and James Hards

asking Council to order a new sidewalk laid on Hill avenue between 5th & 6th streets Block 29 being about 100 feet of walk on North side of Hill avenue east of 5th street. Referred to Street & Alley Committee -

A petition was presented signed by James Purcell, J. H. Ackerman and J. H. Sagrator and J. E. Dulmama asking Council to remit the fines imposed against each of them by Police Magistrate Byers in the cases recently brought against them for keeping open saloons after midnight during the Grand Valley Fruit Fair - Motion made seconded and put that the petition ~~not~~ granted, Hards voted nay, Merrill yea, Rader nay, Ramey yea, Smith nay, Motion lost and the Chair declared the petition granted and fines remitted.

A petition was presented by Nettie W. Blaine asking that she be allowed to fill up the old ditch running along the North and West sides of her property situated on the West side of Spruce street between Main street and Rood streets

On motion the same was referred to the Street & Alley Committee with power to act -

Mr M Laughlin asked that a fire Hydrant be placed at the corner of West street and Colorado avenue - referred to Water & Sewer Committee -

Mr Oakes asked that the water mains be extended 300 feet on West Colo Ave - referred to Water & Sewer Committee

J. H. Van Hoordeke presented a petition asking Council to order sidewalk laid on the North end of Lots 1-2-3-4-5 and 6 in Block 131 City of Grand Jet - referred to Street & Alley Committee -

On motion the Street Supervisor was instructed and directed to shut off ditch water on West main street and also to have the pipes drained thoroughly -

The City Clerks monthly report was ordered placed on file, The report of the Water Superintendent was referred to the Water & Sewer Committee - City Weighers Report referred to finance Committee
