Regular meeting of the City Council Mayor Sampson
in the Chair, The following Aldermen responded to Roll

Aldermen Waldroup and Buckins were absent -

A Motion prevailed to allow all citizens who wished so to do, to address the council. J J Lumsden asked that an arc light be located at the corner of 3d and Broad streets, This being the corner nearest the Auditorium. T.A. Rice also asked that a light be placed at the corner of 1st and ~~Curey~~ ^{Road} streets, J H Hill also requested a light at 3d and Curey streets, after some discussion the three requests were referred to the Light Committee and as Alderman Buckins was absent from the city Alderman Rader was requested to act in his stead -
