Regular Meeting of the City Council Mayor Sampson
in the Chair The following aldermen responded to Roll
call; Buckins, Harde, Merrill, Rader, Ramey, Smith
Atokton and Waldroup

The minutes of January 10th 1905 read and approved
The following petitions were presented -

W^m J Brown and others asking that the water main be
extended on Chipeta Street from 7th Street to 9th Street -
Referred to the Water & Sewer Committee.

The Petition and Bond of M. G. Woolerton as principal and
The American Bonding Company of Baltimore as surety,
in the sum of \$1000⁰⁰ and asking that a plumbers license
be issued to the said M. G. Woolerton, was presented and
as the bond was not in legal form a Motion
was made seconded and put that License to do plumbing
in the city according to the ordinances be issued to the

said M G Woolerston when he has filed a bond, with the same Company as surety, ^{with the City Clerk} and duly passed upon as being in legal form by City Attorney Carnahan.

Buckins voted nay, Harde yea, Merrill nay, Rader nay, Ramey yea, Smith yea, Stockton nay, Waldroup yea, Tie vote
Mayor Sampson's name was called and he voted yea - Carried:

The petition of Harry E. Fulghum for Plumbers license was referred to the license Committee.

The petitions of Ed Coulson and others, C.H. Hoppe and others for sidewalks were referred to the Street & Alley Committee.

The petition of J.B. Arnold asking that a wire fence be removed from Riverview avenue in Crawford's Subdivision was referred to the Marshal for immediate action.

The petition of Otto M. Ferry and others asking that an arc light be located at the intersection of Main and Twelfth street was referred to the Water & Light Committee.

The petition of J.M. Cameron to erect a Corrogated steel building on lot 31 in Block 118 city of Grand Junction was referred to the Fire & Police Committee.

Mr J.M. Bunting was given the privilege of addressing the Council, and asked Council on behalf of the Chamber of Commerce, to appropriate \$100⁰⁰ toward defraying the expenses of a committee to Denver to Boost for the Normal School building. Mr Bunting in a few well chosen words pointed out the advantage and interest such an institution would be to Grand Junction and vicinity.

Motion made seconded and put that \$100⁰⁰ be appropriated and that a warrant be drawn on the General fund after April 1st 1905 for expenses of a committee to boost for the Normal School. Buckins voted yea, Harde yea, Merrill yea, Rader yea, Ramey yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea, Carried:

Mr Morris asked on behalf of the residents in the vicinity of 3^d and South streets, that the electric light be replaced at that corner. Motion made and seconded that the light

be re-located at the corner of 3^d and South streets - after some discussion the motion was withdrawn and a motion prevailed to instruct the Light Committee to get the best price on the installment of incandescent street lights -

C.C. O'Neil asked for a report on the establishment of the

north line of the city - Referred to the Street & Alley Committee -
The matter of placing a fire Hydrant at 7th and Belford was referred to the Water & Sewer Committee

City Engineer Haskell, through the Mayor, asked the privilege of establishing Street and Sidewalk Grades within the boundaries between 3rd and 6th Streets and Rood Street and Colorado Avenue -

City Eng. Haskell grades

Motion made seconded and put that the city engineer be and is hereby instructed to establish street and sidewalk grades within the above boundaries - Buckins voted yea, Hardey yea, Merrill yea, Pades yea, Ramey yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea carried:

in Crawfords addition where sidewalks have been ordered
laid - On motion Council adjourned to meet Tuesday
February 21 1905 at 8 o'clock P.M.
