

Grand Jct Colo Jan 10th 1905

Regular meeting of the City Council Alderman ^{President of} Hards in the chair, The following aldermen responded to roll call, Bucklin, Hards, Rader, Smith and Waldroup, aldermen Merrill, Ramey and Stockton absent, also Mayor Sampliner was absent.

Minutes of December 13th and December 20th read and approved.

A petition was presented from the Library board asking that an arc light be placed at corner of said Library - referred to the Light Committee -

A petition was received from VA Peterson asking that the janitor work be divided between the Teamsters Motion made seconded and put that the janitor work be divided with the Teamsters, Bucklin voted yea Hards yea Rader yea, Smith nay, Waldroup yea carried.

The reports of the Water Superintendent for November and December were read and referred to the Water & Sewer Committee.

The report of the Police magistrate for September was read and referred to the finance committee -

The bids for the Boilers for the Pump house was then opened - There being bids from the Star Boilers & Shut Iron works Denver, Hendrie & Beethoff Denver Parsons construction Company Grand Junction and J J Lumsden Grand Junction - Mr J J Lumsden being the lowest bidder a motion was made seconded and put that the contract furnishing and setting of the said boilers be given to J J Lumsden provided his bid covers delivery at Pump House for the sum of \$2206⁰⁰ the same to include a steam dome for which he is allowed in the above figures \$55⁰⁰ also that 12 gauge iron be used for smoke stack instead of 14 gauge Bucklin voted yea, Hards yea, Rader yea, Smith yea, Waldroup yea - Carried,
