

Grand Junction Colo Feb 21 1905

Adjourned regular meeting of the City Council, Mayor Sampliner in the chair. The following alderman responded to roll call Hards, Merrill, Ramey, Smith, Stockton and Waldroup.

The minutes of February 14 1905 read and approved.

The petition of P.A. Keenan to erect a tent on lots 21 and 22 Block 104 - Referred to Fire & Police Committee -

A Resolution setting forth several needed improvements was presented by the Chamber of Commerce, and ordered placed on file -

Wm McGinley appeared personally and asked that an arc light be located at the corner of 1<sup>st</sup> & Main Streets.

Motion made seconded and put to grant Mr McGinley's request Hards voted yea, Merrill yea, Ramey yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea Waldroup yea Carried
