

Grand Junction Colo

April 11th 1905

Regular meeting of the City Council Mayor Sampliner in the chair, The following aldermen responded to roll call, Buckus, Hards, Merrill, Ramsey, Smith, Stockton, Waldroup. - alderman Rader absent.

The minutes of Feb 21st, March 14th, March 16th, March 28 read corrected and approved.

A communication from the Citizens Gas & Coke Co accepting the provisions of Ordinance #126 granting a franchise to the said Company to build, construct, operate and maintain gas works etc signed by Geo Smith Vice President, E M Alcomb director and attested by George A Currie, Secretary.

was ordered placed on file in the Ordinance Book.

A communication was also received from Geo Smith it being, the official Notification that work had been commenced on the construction of a Street Railway as prescribed by Ordinance #125 and that work should continue and that a guarantee Bond would be furnished in due time - It was accepted and ordered placed on file in the Ordinance Book.

The ^{monthly, + annual} Reports of the City Treasurer, Water Supt, City Weigher, Chief of the Fire Department were read and referred to the proper committees

The following Resolution was introduced by Alderman Smith who moved its adoption -

— Resolution —

Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Mesa County, Colorado;

That Whereas Ordinance No. 126 granting a franchise to The Citizens' Gas & Coke Company for the building of a gas plant, etc., within the city limits of the City of Grand Junction provides that work must be commenced in the building of said plant within six months from the date of the passage of this Ordinance.

And Whereas, the said Ordinance was passed by the City Council on the 24th day of June, 1904, but the vote required by law to be taken thereon by the taxpayers of the City of Grand Junction was not had until the 4th day of April, A.D. 1905.

Therefore be it Resolved that such work shall commence within six months from April 4, 1905, the date said Ordinance was finally adopted by the vote of the taxpayers of the said City of Grand Junction, Mesa County, Colorado. And the acceptance to of said Ordinance No. 126 as therein provided shall be filed by said Company within ten days from the 4th day of April A.D. 1905, the date of the final passage of said Ordinance by the taxpayers of said City at the election held on that day.

The motion being seconded the vote was as follows: Buckins voted yea, Harbo yea, Merrill yea, Ramey yea, Smith yea, Stockton yea, Waldroup yea - Carried.
