There being a quorum present the Mayor announced they would proceed to business.

The minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

Bill of Mrs. C.F. Thompson for nurse during quarantine allowed

Upon request of the Mayor, Council agreed to hear the case of Mrs. C.F. Thompson, and in her behalf City Attorney N.E. Coles presented the following, The City of Grand Junction, to Mrs. C.F. Thompson Dr. to Nursing Mrs. Ora Mitchell and two children, during Six Weeks in quarantine - and for provisions furnished, \$39⁰⁰.

Reconsideration of Scale for Ind. Flu Co Lost

The Select Com. on establishment of Grades for Street and alleys reported that City Engineer Haskell was preparing a Bid for the Cost of Grades. Thereupon the Mayor accepted the report of Com. and empowered them to continue until they brought in a final report.

The Water & Sewers Com. reported in favor of allowing Mr. Robinson to connect with Sewer on east side of 12th & Wood Street.

Alderman O'Boyle entered a motion to adopt report of W & S. Com. Seconded by alderman Smith upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously and was so declared by the Mayor.

Mr. Ramsay addressed Council in regard to extending a 4 inch water main on 7th Street about 300 feet to reach some vacant lots to be built on. This matter was referred to W & S Com. when petition would be presented in writing by Mr. Ramsay.

The Verbal petition of Mrs. J. P. Blank to erect a residence building within the fire limits with a shingle roof was referred to Fire & Police Com.

Alderman Harris entered a complaint against the Independent Ice Co for fencing in Spruce Street between Colowah and Main Street, this was referred to the S & A Com. for them to report next Council meeting.

W. B. Vedder advised Council that it was necessary to have a Fire Hydrant placed at 6th & Belford Street, this was referred to W & S. Com. by the Mayor.

Supervisor Armstrong addressed Council in regard to a communication he received from the S & A. Com. in which he was not to hire any men without their consent. This matter was discussed at length by the Mayor and Council, they asked City Atty N. E. Coler for his opinion, which was that the S & A. Com.

had power to outline the work to be done, and the Supervisor should hire the men, and Superintend the work to be done,

The Bonds and License of Holt + Ember for conducting plumbing business was read also the Bonds of Jos. F. Green and A. P. Wharton for Pl. Police they were referred to License Committee for approval and were approved and accepted by said Committee,

Alderman McCulloch entered a motion that all Persons conducting any business that the City Ordinances provided that a License should be granted for, should promptly pay such License and that same should be enforced without fear or favor to any one. Seconded by Alderman Atkins. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously and was so declared by the Mayor.

The report of City Boilers as inspected by State Boiler Inspector C. R. Taylor and his receipt for ~~Ins~~ \$15⁰⁰ for inspecting Boilers was read and ordered placed on File.

Upon request of Mayor Bunting City Clerk Conley was granted a 15 day leave of absence, Alderman McCulloch entered a motion to adjourn until Wednesday May 31st 8 P.M. 1905. Seconded by Alderman Platt upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously and was so declared by the Mayor. time of adjournment 11 P.M.,
