Ordinance
Extension of
Franchise

The Grand Junction Electric and Gas Company having presented a proposed ordinance granting to said Company an extension or renewal of its franchise, and for a franchise for the operation and maintenance of a plant or plants for the generation and transmission of electricity for light, power or any other purpose, within the corporate limits of the city of Grand Junction, State of Colorado, the same came on for consideration by the Council. And the Company having filed with the city clerk of the City of Grand Junction proof of the publication in due form of law of a notice of its application for the passage of such ordinance, in full conformity with the provisions of Section 2 of an Act concerning the initiation, introduction, publication and passage of ordinances granting franchises or licenses for street railways, electric light works, telegraph and telephone systems in incorporated town and cities of the first and second class, and repealing all Acts and parts of Acts in conflict herewith. Approved April 6th, 1905, Session Laws 1905, page 292,

The said notice of application was read by the clerk, and also the publisher's affidavit thereto attached. Such proposed ordinance was then ^{introduced} ~~presented~~ and read for the first time, and after such reading of the ordinance, it being the desire of the council to further consider the granting of the rights and privileges sought for by the passage of such ordinance, it was moved by Alderman Morris, and seconded by Alderman Lutas that such proposed ordinance be published in the manner and for the time required by law, same to be published daily in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Grand Junction for a period of not less than two weeks prior to the time such ordinance shall again be read and put upon its passage, as provided by law. On roll call all Aldermen present voting "yea" ^{yea} the motion was ^{daily} declared carried by the Mayor.

It was moved by Alderman Morris and seconded by Alderman Lutas that publication of such proposed ordinance be made in the Daily Sentinel.
