

Grand Junction Colo Sept 13th 1905.

Roll Call

Convened at regular meeting, Mayor Bunting presiding. upon call of roll the following responded present, Alderman Davies, Lutes, M^c Cullock, Boyle, Platt, Smith and City Attorney N. E. Coker.

Minutes

The reading of minutes of Aug 9+15 were approved as read.

Petition of P. A. Rice for a R.R. track across 5th St.

P. A. Rice petitioned for permission to grant the R. R. Co to build across 5th St an extension of their track, to reach his lots, this was referred to the S & A Com. for report.

Petition of Mrs. Nora B. Spear Sidewalk on W. St.

Mrs. Nora B. Spear and others petitioned Council to order a sidewalk laid on the North side of W. Ave. between 2nd + 3rd streets, to connect with the sidewalks now laid, said petition was referred to the S & A Com.

Petition of D. F. Ingersoll for sidewalk south side Belford bet 6 + 7th

D. F. Ingersoll and others petitioned Council to order a sidewalk laid on the south side of Belford between 6th + 7th St. lots 1 to 13 Inc. Block 17, this was referred to the S & A Com.

S. N. Wheeler Petition for plank crossing on Road ave bet 5 + 6

S. N. Wheeler Esq. was present and in behalf of the School board, he requested that a plank crossing be laid directly across Road St. from the High School to the Whitier school. thereupon Alderman Smith entered a motion that the Street Commissioner be instructed to lay a plank crossing soon as possible, as requested by Mr. Wheeler, seconded by Alderman Lutes upon call of motion, said motion carried unanimously and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ed. Haskell poverty plea

Ed. Haskell was present and in behalf of the owners and managers of the Park Opera House Auditorium and Purn Verkin Hall he made a poverty plea and asked the Council to remit the license fee as required by Ordinance. thereupon Alderman Lutes entered a motion to remit the license fees on the play houses in the

City, seconded by alderman Davies, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously and was so declared by the Mayor.

Officers Reports

The Officers reports for August were read as follows, City Clerk, Water Superintendent, City Treasurer and Police Magistrate. Said reports were referred to the Finance Com.

Arranging to notify people to lay sidewalks

Alderman McCulloch entered a motion that the Street Commissioners call upon the property owners that have been heretofore notified to lay sidewalks adjacent to their property and instruct those that have not complied to do so at once or the City would lay the walks and assess against property as taxes, and report said action to Sra Com. Seconded by alderman Davies, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously and was so declared by the Mayor.

Spel Com. Reports

Chairman Platt of Sra Com. reported that the Com. reported favorable for the laying of 4" Stone flagging at a cost of \$1.50 per running foot. five feet wide on 4th & Colo Ave. and recommended that the ^{Board} sidewalks on Main St between 3rd & 4th St. be condemned and good Cement sidewalks be ordered constructed. Whereupon alderman McCulloch entered a motion to accept said report and Council ratify same seconded by Alderman O'Boyle upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously and was so declared by the Mayor.

Chairman O'Boyle of Spel Committee for the establishing of grades for streets and alleys requested that Council take action on the profiles drawn by Engineer Haskell after considerable discussion, it was decided that the Spel Com. meet with Engineer Haskell and prepare a report and present same to Council next meeting.

Chairman Gates of Spel Com. on repairs of Fire Hall reported that all repairs were about completed.

Chairman Davies of Water & Sewers Com. made an itemized report of the expenditures of Water System for 30 days.

Alderman Jutes entered a motion that the bills be allowed and warrants drawn for same seconded by Alderman Boyle upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance 131
passed and
adopted

Ordinance No. 131, Amending Section Eleven of Article 3 of Ordinance 83, being an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance concerning offenses in the nature of Misdemeanors and prescribing penalties for violation thereof" passed and adopted the 30th day of June A.D. 1899. was read at length, this being the second reading, first reading, 12th day July A.D. 1905. Thereupon Alderman Boyle entered a motion to make an amendment to Section 2 as follows all Public Parks in the City shall be under the

control and management of the Street Commissioner, subject to the order and direction of the City Council; and that no person or Persons shall use any public park within the City for the purpose or place of making any public speech or any address, to bodies or crowds there assembled, without first having had and obtained a written permit, so to do, from the City Council of the City, seconded by Alderman Davies upon call of motion for the Amendment Vote was as follows Davies yea, Luter yea, McCulloch yea, Bayle yea, Platt yea, Smith yea there being all yeas amendment was declared carried by the Mayor.

^{Ordinance} Thereupon Ald. Bayle entered a motion that the original, as amended be adopted, seconded by Ald. Davies upon call of motion vote was as follows Alderman Davies yea, Luter yea, McCulloch yea, Bayle yea, Platt yea, Smith yea, there being all yeas said ordinance was declared passed and adopted by the Mayor.

The Bill of J. B. Hutchinson for \$142.⁵⁰ rendered against the City was referred to the finance Com.

Ald. Davies entered a motion to adjourn until next regular meeting Oct. 11th seconded by Alderman Smith upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously and was so declared by the Mayor.
