McCulloch made a motion seconded by ald. Boyle that the S & A Com. investigate and report. upon call of roll said motion carried unanimously.

Firemen.

Fire Chief Rogers recommended that after Jan 1st 1906 the Volunteer firemen receive \$1.00 per hour for the first hour and 50 cents per hour for each succeeding hour that they are out at a called fire. this was referred to the Fire Police Com.

Ald. Boyle entered a motion seconded by ald. Platt that Council go into executive session upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

ald. Futer made a motion seconded by ald. Platt that the City Clerk have authority to draw warrants to cover the expenses incurred by the Spl. Water Com. when presented by them upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ald. Smith entered a motion seconded by ald. Platt to create a spl Sewer Fund and place to the credit of same the \$100.00 received from the Indian School for the purpose of paying extra expenses of maintaining the sewer system. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
