

Grand Junction Colo. Feb. 15<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1906.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, convened, at a regular adjourned session, Mayor Banting presiding upon call of roll the following responded present Alderman Alkire, Davies, Lutes, M<sup>c</sup>. Culloch, Harris, Boyle, Platt & City Atty. K. C. Coles. Ald. Smith arrived a few minutes late.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as corrected.

Chairman Harris of the Fire Police Com. reported favorable upon the petition of A. N. Anderson to rebuild on lot 22 B 119 thereupon Ald. Platt made a motion seconded by Ald. Boyle that the report of Com. be sustained and ratified, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Harris of the Fire Police Com. reported unfavorable upon the petition of H. L. Hiatt to build an extension to his building on lot 7 Block 125, thereupon Ald. Boyle made a motion seconded by Ald. Davies that the report of Com. be sustained and ratified upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Harris of the Fire Police Com. recommends a favorable report for the petition of W. C. Boyer to erect a bowling alley, Ald. Boyle entered a motion seconded by Ald. Platt that the report be accepted upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ald. Lutes made a motion seconded by Ald. Boyle that the original petition of W. C. Boyer be granted, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ald. Harris inquired as to who was erecting a building on 4th Street between 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> and if the Council had granted them a permit to build as it was within the fire limits, Council had not granted a permit, thereupon Ald. M<sup>c</sup>. Culloch made a motion seconded by Ald. Davies that the City Marshal be instructed to have the work stopped on the said building, until the Contractor appeared before the City Council and secure a permit for same, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ald. M<sup>c</sup>. Culloch introduced an Ordinance as follows entitled "An Ordinance Amending Sections Seven, Eight, and Nine of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Fire Limits" the same was read at length in open Council and ordered published in the official paper.



Ald. Lutes introduced and moved the adoption of the following Resolution. — <sup>seconded by Ald. Norris</sup> Whereas; many petitions, at diverse and sundry times, have been presented to us as members of the City Council, asking us to pledge ourselves to the granting of permits or to the using of our influence, in certain lines of policy or action at the regular session of this body, and Whereas;

such pledge or action on our part would be illegal and inconsistent with our untrammelled freedom in this body Politic, therefore be it resolved; that we each as members of this City Council of the City of Grand Junction, refrain so far as in us lies from committing ourselves personally, on all questions of policy or expediency that is liable to come before this Council to be acted on as a body. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
