

Grand Junction Colorado, March 14th A.D. 1906.

Roll Call

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened ~~in~~ at a regular meeting thereof, Mayor Bunting presiding, upon call of roll the following responded present, Alderman Alkire, Davies, Lutes, M^o. Cullack, Norris, Boyle, ^{and} Smith and Alderman Blatt and City atty Coles arrived a few minutes late.

Minutes.

The minutes of previous meetings of Feb. 21st and Feb. 28th were read and approved.

The petition of Lewis & Sallee protesting the proposed changes to be made in the Ordinance # 96 governing plumbing was read, Mr. Leaverton their attorney was present and was

granted permission, to explain to the Council the reasons set forth by Lewis and Sallee, protesting against the proposed changes in Ordinance # 96, thereupon the Mayor referred said petition to the License Committee.

Officers Reports. The following Reports of Officers was read and referred to the Finance Committee, City Treasurer, Police Magistrate, Water Superintendent, City Clerk, Chairman of the Water Committee and the yearly report of the Board of Directors of the Carnegie Public Library and the Librarian,

Librarian's yearly report vote of thanks extended. Thereupon Alderman Davies seconded by Alderman Boyle made a motion, that the Council accept the report of the Board of Directors and the Librarian of the Carnegie Public Library, and to extend to them a vote of thanks for the complete and intelligent yearly report prepared by them, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

C. W. Haskell City Engineer C. W. Haskell was present and recommended that some action be taken in regard to making a permanent survey for the south & West boundary lines of the City, this was referred to the Street & Alley Committee in conjunction with the City Attorney and City Engineer.

Pacific Coast Pipe Line Agent Greenwood Mr. Greenwood representing the Pacific Coast Pipe Line Co. was present and upon request of Council, he made a brief address on the qualities of wooden pipe, as a water conduit.

Barton & Platt contract for hauling freight. Barton & Platt made application for the privilege of hauling the City Freight, thereupon Alderman Lutes made a motion seconded by Alderman Smith, that Barton & Platt become the official haulers of the City, subject to the will of the Council, at the regulation rates charged for drayage in Grand Junctions, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Building Inspector Fire Chief Rogers recommended that the Council appoint a Building Inspector at a salary of \$25⁰⁰ per month, and that no buildings be allowed to be erected within the City limits, until there is a permit granted by the City Council signed by the City Clerk and Mayor, and that the fire Ordinance be revised, this was referred to the Fire & Police Committee.

Cleaning the City Ditches Street Commissioner Armstrong brought up the matter of cleaning the City ditches, after considerable discussion Alderman Smith made a motion seconded by Alderman Platt that the Street Commissioner notify the property owners to clean the ditches adjacent to their property, and to order published in the daily papers for five days Sections 9 and 13 of Ordinance # 2 governing the cleaning of same upon call of motion said motion

H.R. Rhone to

Carried unanimously.

H.R. Rhone was present and made a verbal request for Council to allow him to couple with the sewer on 12th Street at his own expense, thereupon Alderman Davies made a motion seconded by Alderman Futes that H.R. Rhone's request be granted upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Norris made a motion seconded by Alderman Smith that all gardens be shut out from using water from the City ~~main~~ ^{main} water works this year, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Norris made a motion seconded by Alderman Boyle that all the bills as read be allowed and warrants be drawn for same upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ordinance #134 adopted.

An Ordinance, annual appropriation Ordinance of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, provides for the expenses of the City of Grand Junction, for the fiscal year beginning April 1st 1906, and ending March 31st 1907, was read at length the same being the second reading of said Ordinance, thereupon Alderman Boyle made a motion seconded by Alderman M^c Culloch that said Ordinance be passed and adopted, and to be known as Ordinance number 134, upon call of roll vote was as follows Alderman Alkire yea, Davies yea, Luter yea, M^c Culloch yea, Norris yea, Boyle yea, Platt yea, Smith yea, motion Carried.

Ordinance #135 adopted

An Ordinance amending sections 7-8+9 of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance concerning the Fire Limits". The same was read at length, being the second reading, thereupon Alderman Luter made a motion seconded by Alderman Boyle that said Ordinance be passed and adopted and to be known as Ordinance number 135, upon call of roll vote was as follows, Alderman Alkire yea Davies yea, Luter yea, M^c Culloch yea, Norris yea, Boyle yea Platt yea, Smith yea motion Carried.

Stand pipe Com. appointed.

Alderman M^c Culloch made a motion that a Committee of three be appointed to investigate and report the condition of the old water works stand pipe and to recommend what shall be done with same, seconded by Alderman Smith upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously. The Committee appointed by the Mayor are as follows, Alderman M^c Culloch, Boyle & Smith.

Volunteer firemen pay raised

Alderman Norris recommended that the pay of the volunteer firemen be raised to the amount of \$1.00 per hour for the first hour and 50 cents per hour thereafter, upon response to an alarm of fire, thereupon Alderman Platt made a motion seconded by Alderman Boyle that said report be sustained and Council ratify same upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Luter entered a complaint in regard

Police instructed to men and boys gathering in crowds upon the sidewalks and making to disperse crowds it unpleasant for passersby, thereupon Alderman Davies made a motion on sidewalks seconded by Alderman McCulloch that the Marshal and Police Officers be instructed to disperse any and all crowds that gather upon the sidewalks and corners of this City, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Report unfavorable
petition of

Chairman Norris of the first Police Committee reported unfavorable upon the petition of J. M. Perry to move a building from 427 Colo ave to 610 Colo ave. thereupon Alderman Boyle made a motion seconded by Alderman McCulloch that the report be sustained, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Boyle made a motion seconded by Alderman Platt to adjourn until March 21st, A. D. 1906, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
