The following communication from City Engineer Char. W. Haskell was read: In order that there may be some uniformity in the laying of cement walks in the city. I would advise that a resolution or ordinance be passed, regulating the distance of the inside of the walks from the lot lines. at present owners of property are building there walks from the lot lines to four feet distance from same; creating a decided jig when on the same block and side. A regulation limiting this distance to two or three feet would be decidedly beneficial.
