The special Com. appointed for the removal of stand pipe on N. 7th street reported that they had completed the task, thereupon Alderman Futes made a motion seconded by Alderman Boyle that the report of Committee be accepted and Committee discharged with a vote of thanks for the services they had performed, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Norris made a motion seconded by Alderman Davies that the Mayor be empowered to make the very best arrangement possible with the County

Commissioners, for the handling of the Hobors this summer upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Amendment of Sec. 10 of Ord 125 passed first reading.

Alderman Futes introduced by request an Amendment to Sec. 10 of Ordinance No. 125, being an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance granting to George Smith, his successors and assigns, the right to construct maintain and operate a system of street railway and granting the right of way therefor, within the City of Grand Junction Colorado," said Ordinance was read at length in open Council, and ^{then} upon ~~motion~~ ^{made a motion} of Alderman Futes seconded by Alderman Smith that Ordinance pass its first reading and be published in the Grand Junction Daily News as required by law and the applicants for the extension of franchise pay the expense of publication, upon call of roll votes was as follows, Alderman Davis yea, Futes yea, M^c Culloch yea, Norris yea, Boyle yea, Smith yea, motion carried.

The following proposition was presented by the Hon. J. S. Carnahan in behalf of the Citizens Gas & Coke Co.

The City of Grand Junction to furnish the lamps and posts at a cost not to exceed \$25.00 for each post, if at the end of six months the City will enter into a contract with the Gas Co. for lighting, at a price to be agreed upon, we hereby agree to purchase the posts from the City at the price paid by them. During the six months the undersigned Company agree to keep all lights in good repair and to light and extinguish same on the same schedule now in force in the City.
