

Grand Junction Colo. June 26th. A. D. 1906.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened pursuant to adjournment from June 21st. A. D. 1906. Mayor Bunting presiding, upon call of roll the following responded present, Alderman Davies, Lutes, M^c. Culloch, Norris, and Boyle, absent alderman Alkire, Platt and Smith.

The minutes of previous meeting were read, City Engineer Chas. W. Haskell requested that the protest he made to Council June 20th be inserted in the minutes thereupon Alderman Boyle made a motion seconded by Alderman Davies that the minutes be approved as read upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

A. P. Wharton petitioned for his pay as Policeman to be increased to the standard pay this was referred to the Fire and Police Committee.

J. S. Carnahan ^{and A. W. Moody,} was present in behalf of the Chamber of Commerce and verbally requested that the Council have the City Physician investigate the cause of the Typhoid fever cases in the City at the present, and take some steps to have same checked, the matter was referred to the City Physician and Board of Health.

A verbal request was made to have some plan devised to make uniform the laying of street guttering and Curbing in front of the Margery building, Alderman M^c. Culloch made a motion seconded by Alderman Davies that the matter be referred to the street and alley Committee and City Engineer with power to set, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Norris introduced an Ordinance
entitled an Ordinance to authorize the City Council of the City

the water works, Plant and System now owned and in

on behalf of the said City, by the issuance of its bonds in
the sum of \$300,000 for such purpose and to submit such
approval and authorization to the voters of the City, who
are taxpayers under the law. ~~The~~ said Ordinance was read
at length in open Council it being first reading of same,
thereupon Alderman Norris made a motion seconded by Alderman
Lutes that said Ordinance pass its first reading and be published
in the Official Paper. Alderman M^c. Cullloch offered an
amendment to the original motion that said Ordinance be
published in the Daily News seconded by Alderman Lutes.
at this point City Atty N. E. Coles made a protest against the
passing of the proposed Ordinance said protest is now on file in
the office of the City Clerk.
