The City Council of the City of Grand Jct.

create an
indebtedness
of \$300,000
for extension
of Water Works.

The Ordinance to be known as No. 138 being an Ordinance to create an indebtedness in order to raise money for the improvement, repair, extension and enlargement of its present water works, and water system, and to purchase or acquire the necessary water for such extension and enlargement of said water system, for the purpose of supplying the said City and its inhabitants with a mountain water system, by the issuance of its bonds in the sum of \$300,000 redeemable in ten 10 years and absolutely due and payable in fifteen 15 years from the date of issuance, which said bonds shall be in such form and bear such rate of interest as may be hereafter determined by said City Council. Said Ordinance was read at length in open Council and was fully considered, thereupon Ald. Norris made a motion seconded by Ald. Alkire that said Ordinance No. 138 be passed and adopted, upon call of roll vote was as follows. Alderman Alkire yea, Davies yea, Lutes yea, M^c. Cullach yea, Norris yea, Smith yea, motion Carried.

The following call for a special election to be held August 1st A. D. 1906. was introduced by Alderman Lutes and read at length by the City Clerk.

(Notice of Special Election)

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, did on the 11th day of July, A. D. 1906, at a regular meeting of said City Council, after due and legal publication thereof, as by law prescribed, pass and adopt the following Ordinance.

Ordinance No. 138

An Ordinance to authorize the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, to improve, repair, enlarge and extend the Water Works, Plant and System, now owned and in operation in said City of Grand Junction, so as to acquire mountain water to be taken from some mountain locality near or adjacent to said City, by the issuance of its bonds in the sum of \$300,000 for such purpose and to submit such approval and authorization to the voters of the City, who are taxpayers under the law.

And whereas said Ordinance No. 138 was thereafter and on to-wit the 11th day of July, A. D. 1906, duly approved and signed by John Boyle, as temporary President of said City Council acting in the absence of the Mayor of said City from said City.

Now therefore in pursuance of the order of said City Council, of said City of Grand Junction, and in pursuance of the requirements and authority in said Ordinance No. 138 contained public notice is hereby given that a special election, to be held by the qualified voters of said City, who are taxpayers under the law, is hereby called to be held on the first day of August, A. D. 1906, between the hours of Seven (7) O'clock A. M. and Seven (7) O'clock P. M. of said day, in said City, for the purpose of permitting the qualified voters of said City, who are taxpayers under the law, to vote upon the proposition of authorizing the said City of Grand Junction, to improve, repair, enlarge and extend the Water Works, plant and system, now owned and in operation in said City of Grand Junction, so as to acquire mountain water for said City, to be taken from some mountain locality near or adjacent to said City, and to contract an indebtedness on behalf of the said City by the issuance of its bonds in the sum of \$300,000 for such purpose, and to submit such approval and authorization to the voters of the City who are taxpayers under the law, as in said Ordinance No. 138 specified.

said election shall be by ballot, those voting for the approval thereof shall have written or printed upon

their ballots the words. " For the Improvement, repair enlargement and extension of the City Water Works and the issuance of the Bonds;" and those voting against the approval thereof, shall have written or printed, upon their ballots the words. " Against the Improvement, repair, enlargement and extension of the City Water works and the issuance of the bonds." said ballots shall be deposited in a ballot box, to be provided by the City Council for that purpose, and shall be Canvassed, and return made, as provided by law.

The qualified voters and electors of the First ward in said City, will vote upon said proposition, on said day at 204 Colorado Avenue, Dowrey Building.

The qualified voters and electors of the Second ward in said City, will vote upon said proposition, on said day at Second + Main Streets, Turner Hall.

The qualified voters and electors of the East third ward in said City, will vote upon said proposition on said day at Seventh and Main Streets, Dowdens Marble Shop.

The qualified voters and electors of the West third ward in said City, will vote upon said proposition, on said day at 217 North Fifth Street.

The qualified voters and electors of the Fourth ward, in said City, will vote upon said proposition, on said day at Sixth and Colorado Avenue, City Hall.

Only such qualified voters and electors of said City as are taxpayers under the law, will be permitted to vote upon said proposition on said day.

Alderman Lutes made a motion seconded by Alderman Norris that the call for The special election to be held August 1st A. D. 1906, in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado and Ordinance No 138 be passed and adopted and ordered published in the Daily News of said City according to law, also that Ordinance No. 138 be published in the Daily News, upon call of roll vote was as follows, Alderman Alkira yea, Ed Davis yea, Lutes yea, M^{rs} Callach yea, Norris yea, Smith yea, motion Carried.
