The City Council of the City of Grand

Junction Convened in regular session Mayor Bunting presiding upon call of roll the following responded present Alderman Alkin, Futer, Norris, Platt & Smith Alderman M.C. Culloch and Boyle arrived a few minutes late, absent Alderman Davies. Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

Pipe granted

The Grand Valley Fruit & Produce Ass'n by A.B. Campbell Ingr. petitioned to be allowed to lay a 2 inch pipe line for water, to be laid at their own expense and turned over to the City. Commencing at the corner of South and 9th streets and ending at their building, to be used for fire protection. This was referred to the water and lights Com. thereupon Ald. Norris made a motion seconded by Ald. Smith that the petition of The Grand Valley Fruit & Produce Ass'n be granted. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

W.F. White petitioned for a permit to erect an iron clad building 25 by 50 feet on lot No. 12 in Block No. 103 to be used for delivery horses, said petition was referred to the Fire & Police Com.

Water Superintendent Vedder reported that Plumber C. P. Probitz had continually violated the Ordinance governing Plumbing and ordered the City Clerk to refuse to issue him any further permits until Council met, and he reported the action he had taken, thereupon Ald. Boyle made a motion seconded by Ald. Alkire that C. P. Probitz license be revoked until such time that he would place all his work in a good sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Water & Sewers. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Vedder also reported that Mr. A. A. Miller had been notified to connect his property located on Main Street between 5th & 6th Streets, with the sewer Mr. Miller had failed to do so, and he asked Council to take action against Mr. Miller, there was no action taken.

Street Commissioner Armstrong recommended that Cement Sidewalks be ordered laid on the north side of Wte Street between 5th & 6th Streets, thereupon Alderman M. C. Chairman Norris of the Fire & Police Com. reported that the Corral on the Corner of 5th & Wte Streets had become a nuisance to the residents living near there and recommended the removal of said Corral, thereupon Ald. Platt made a motion seconded by Alderman Boyle that the report of Chairman Norris be accepted and sustained upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

The applications were accompanied by several letters of recommendations and reference, the applications were referred to the water Com. for examination and recommendation to the City Council.

Ordinance #139 first reading

Ald. Platt introduced an Ordinance providing for the contracting of an indebtedness on behalf of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado and upon the credit thereof by the issuance of the negotiable Coupon bonds of said City in the sum of \$300,000 for the purpose of raising money for the improvement, repair, enlargement and extension of the water works, plant and system, now owned and operated within said City of Grand Junction and to acquire mountain water for said system, in order to carry out the provisions of Ordinance number 138 of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, passed, approved and adopted by the City Council of said City on the 11th day of July A.D. 1906. Said Ordinance was read at length in open Council by the City Clerk. Thereupon Alderman Harris made a motion seconded by Alderman Smith that said Ordinance pass its first reading and be published in the Herald the official paper of the City of Grand Junction according to law. Upon call of roll vote was as follows, Alderman Altira yea. Lutes yea. Mc. Cullach yea. Harris yea. Bayle yea. Platt yea. Smith yea. motion carried.

Rule 2 changed to read 2nd & 4th Wednesday of each month

Alderman M. C. Cullach introduced the following resolution, "Resolution Amending Rule two relating to order and business of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado."

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, that rule number two of the order of business of said City Council, providing for the regular meeting of said City Council, to be held on the second Wednesday of each and every month at the hour of 8 o'clock, P.M. be amended so as to read as follows.

Rule 2. The City Council shall meet regularly on the second and fourth Wednesday of each and every month at the hour of 8 o'clock, P.M. and at such other time as they may in their discretion deem proper.

Alderman Platt made a motion seconded by Alderman Luter that said resolution be passed and adopted, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Sidewalks reported in bad condition

Alderman Harris reported the sidewalks on Pitkin ave 2nd & 3rd and South streets in bad condition the street & alley Com. and street Commissioner were instructed to examine said walks and make a report on same.

J. F. Moore makes request for a light on the R.R.

Mr. John F. Moore was present and made a verbal request for an arc light to be placed on the South 7th Street and the R.R. crossing, this was referred to the Water & Light Com.
