to sell Bonds
\$300,000.

Ordinance no. 139. an Ordinance providing for the contracting of an indebtedness on behalf of the city of Grand Junction, Colorado. and upon the credit thereof by the issuance of the negotiable coupon bonds of said City in the sum of three hundred thousand (\$300,000) for the purpose of raising money for the Improvement, Repair, Enlargement and Extension of the Water Works, Plant and System, now owned and operated within said City of Grand Junction and to acquire mountain water for said system, in order to carry out the provisions of Ordinance no. 138 of the city of Grand Junction, Colorado, Passed, approved and adopted by the City Council of said City on the 11th day of July A. D. 1906,

Said Ordinance no. 139 was read at length in open Council and was fully considered by said Council ~~and~~ the same being the second reading of said Ordinance no. 139 as by law required, thereupon Alderman Smith made a motion seconded by Alderman Platt that Ordinance no. 139 be passed and adopted and ordered same to be published in the Herald according to law. upon call of roll vote was as follows Alderman Davies yea, Lutes yea, M^c. Culloch yea, Morris yea, Platt yea, Smith yea the vote being unanimous said motion was declared carried by the Mayor.

Clerk to advertise
Sale of Bonds

Alderman M^c. Culloch made a motion seconded by Alderman Lutes that the City Clerk legally advertise the sale of \$300,000 bonds in such papers as are necessary, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Davies made a motion seconded by Alderman Smith to adjourn until Oct 24th A. D. 1906 upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
