Vinton as driver of the Fire Dept be sustained, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Reports of Officers

The following reports of officers were read and referred to the finance committee, City Treasurer, City Clerk, City Sealer, Water Supt and Police Magistrate.

Petitions rejected

Chairman Harris of the Fire & Police Board reported unfavorable upon the petitions of F. Jaques, E. A. Krohn and F. R. Gatt to erect and move buildings situated within the fire limits, thereupon Ald. Davis made a motion seconded by Ald. Platt that the report of Chairman Harris be accepted and sustained, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Upon request of Fire Chief Rogers, Ald. Norris made a motion seconded by Ald. Lutes that H. P. DeLong agent for the property owned by Amos Clark and situated at 336 Colo. Ave. be notified to clear the debris from said premises caused by fire at once, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Bid for safe
refused

J. W. Osborn & Son offered \$106.⁰⁰ for the safe owned by the City and advertised for sale, thereupon Ald. Lutes made a motion seconded by Ald. Platt that said bid be laid on the table upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Proof of publication of notice of application for a franchise by the Grand Jet. Co. was read, evidence of publication according to law submitted to Council

The following Ordinance making application for extending the franchise of the Grand Junction Electric and Gas Company was introduced by Alderman Lutes.

Ordinance No. 140.

A Bill for an Ordinance extending the franchise of The Grand Junction Electric and Gas Company.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado:

Ordinance 140
Passed first

Electric Light
Franchise

That, whereas, on November 24th, 1890, an Ordinance was adopted by the board of trustees of the town of Grand Junction granting to J. Prowbridge Bailey and Thomas B. Stearns and their legal representatives the right, among other things, to construct, maintain and operate an electric lighting plant in the then town, now city, of Grand Junction; and

Whereas, the said Bailey, Stearns, their successors and assigns forfeited all rights under said Ordinance save and except the right to construct, maintain and operate an electric lighting plant, which franchise is now vested in the Grand Junction Electric and Gas Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Colorado; and

Whereas, the said Company is the only corporation or person furnishing electric lights to the City of Grand Junction and its inhabitants, and it is desired that said Company shall continue to furnish electric lights as aforesaid and for that purpose shall extend its transmission lines to all parts of said City, and the said Company is unwilling to extend its transmission lines unless its franchise, which expires on November 24th, 1910 is extended; and etc.

Said Ordinance was read at length in open Council also the publication of the proposed Ordinance which was published in the Daily Sentinel from Oct. 30th A.D. 1906 to Nov. 14th A.D. 1906 also the proof of said publication was read.

Thereupon Alderman Lutes made a motion seconded by Alderman Boyle that said Ordinance No. 140 pass its first reading and be published in the Daily Sentinel at the expense of the Grand Junction Electric & Gas Company as required by law. Thereupon ~~upon~~ upon call of motion vote was as follows Alderman Davies yea, Lutes yea, Norris yea, Boyle yea, Platt yea, Smith yea, motion carried.

Ald. Platt made a motion seconded by Ald. Norris, that City Engineer Haskell be requested to appoint one

City Engineer requested to appoint 2 Deputies or more deputies to assume the duties of City Engineer during his absence from the city. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Lewis & Dallee filed a plumbers bond for \$1,000.00 by the U. S. Fidelity & Guaranty Co. for one year from Nov. 8th. 1906, Ald. Smith made a motion seconded by Ald. Boyle that the bond be accepted upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

ald. Lutas made a motion seconded by ald. Norris that a sidewalk be ordered laid along the east side of West ave. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Commission granted labour Hotel to build Vestibule

Chairman Norris of the F.P. Com. reported favorable upon the petition of R. J. Neering to build a vestibule on his Hotel. thereupon Ald. Boyle made a motion seconded by Ald. Futes that the report be accepted and sustained upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Electric sign over 5 & 10 Cent store ordered moved back to 30 Inches

Chairman Norris of the F.P. Com. reported unfavorable upon the petition of H. F. Schultz to erect an electric sign in front of the Senate Saloon unless he lived up to the Ordinance governing same, and recommended that the electric sign placed over the 5 & 10 Cent Store building be moved back so it comes within the distance required by Ordinance.

Ald. Boyle made a motion seconded by Ald. Futes that the report of Chairman Norris be accepted and sustained upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
