The following reports of Officers were read Water, Sanitation City Press, City Clerk, City Scales, and Police Magistrate said reports were referred to the Finance Com.

Ordinance No. 140, a Bill for an Ordinance extending the Franchise of the Grand Junction Electric and Gas Company. Taken up for Consideration. Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado:

Ordinance #140 read second time

Extending Light Franchise 25 years from 1910

That, whereas, on November 24th, 1890, an ordinance was adopted by the Board of Trustees of the town of Grand Junction granting to J. Proubridge Bailey and Thomas B. Stearns, and their legal representatives the rights, among other things, to construct, maintain and operate an electric lighting plant in the then town, now City, of Grand Junction; and Whereas, the said Bailey, Stearns, their successors, and assigns forfeited all rights under said ordinance save and accept the right to construct, maintain and operate an electric lighting plant, which franchise is now vested in the Grand Junction Electric and Gas Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the state of Colorado; and

Whereas, the said Company is the only Corporation or person furnishing electric lights to the City of Grand Junction and its inhabitants, and it is desired that said Company shall extend its transmission lines to all parts of said City, and the said Company is unwilling to extend its transmission lines unless its franchise, which expires on Nov. 24th, 1910, is extended; and etc.

Ord. #140 Passed and adopted

Said Ordinance #140, was read in full in open Council the same being the second reading of said ordinance. thereupon Ald. Davies made a motion seconded by Ald Mc Culloch that said Ordinance No 140 be adopted, upon call of roll vote was as follows, Ald. Altire yea, Davies yea, Lutes yea, Mc Culloch yea, Hornis yea, Boyle yea, Platt yea, Smith yea. motion Carried.

Ord #141 passed first reading

Ald. Platt introduced the following Ordinance amendment to section 10 Ordinance No. 125 Ordinance No 137. An Ordinance to amend section 10 of ordinance No. 125, being an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance granting to George Smith, his successors and assigns, the right to construct, maintain and operate a system of street railway, and granting the right of way therefor, within the City of Grand Junction, Colorado;

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado that section 10 of Ordinance No. 125 being an ordinance granting to George Smith, his successors and assigns the right to construct maintain and operate a system of street railway, and granting a right of way therefor

within the City of Grand Junction.

Said Ordinance was read at length in open Council the same being the first reading of said Ordinance. Ald. Luttre made a motion seconded by Ald. Platt that said Ordinance pass its first reading and be published in the Daily News for the period required by law, at the expense of George Smith upon call of roll vote was as follows, Ald.
