

Grand Junction, Colo. March 13th, A.D. 1907

Roll Call

Meeting convened in first regular monthly session, President of the Council Bayle presiding in the absence of Mayor Gentry from the City, upon call of roll the following responded present, Alderman Davis, Lutes, McCulloch, Morris & Platt. Ald. Smith arrived a few minutes late, absent Alderman Altin.

Minutes

The minutes of Feb. 27th were read and approved.

Certified Check Mitchell Engg & Bldg. Co. requesting the return of their proposal returned to Mr. Mitchell for the building of the Kamah Creek pipe line, and their Certified Check for \$5,000.00. Thereupon Ald. Morris made a motion seconded by Ald. Smith that the Certified Check and proposal be returned to Mr. Mitchell upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Pet. of Geo.

J. D. Williams presented a petition asking for a right of way with permission to build a railroad to build RR. track across South Ave between 6th & 7th Streets and also across the alley running East and West in block 149.

Ald. Lutes made a motion seconded by Ald. Platt that said petition be granted provided they establish a grade in conformity with the street grade. motion was withdrawn, and petition was referred to the Soa. Com. for investigation.
