

Grand Junction, Colo. March 13th, A.D. 1907

Roll Call

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in first regular monthly session, President of the Council Bayle presiding in the absence of Mayor Cuming from the City, upon call of roll the following responded present, Alderman Davies, Lutes, McCulloch, Harris & Platt Ald. Smith arrived a few minutes late. absent Alderman Altire.

Certified Check returned to Mitchell

a communication was read from the Mitchell Aug & Bldg. Co requesting the return of their proposal for the building of the Kannah Creek pipe line, and their Certified Check for \$5,000.00. Thereupon Ald. Harris made a motion seconded by Ald. Smith that the Certified Check and proposal be returned to Mr. Mitchell upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Geo. J. D. Williams presented a petition asking for a right of way with permission to build a railroad track across South Ave between 6th & 7th Streets and also across the alley running East and West in block 149.
