

Grand Junction, Colo. April 10<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1907.

Roll call

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in first regular monthly session, Mayor Bunting presiding, upon call of roll the following responded present, Alderman Davies, M. C. Culloch, Norris, Platt & Smith Alderman Lutes arrived a few minutes late, absent Aldermen Alkin & Boyle and City Atty. Cole.

Minutes

The minutes of March 27<sup>th</sup> were read and approved, the minutes of meeting held April 4<sup>th</sup> were read Alderman Norris protested on account of not being notified that there was to be a special meeting held on that date, the minutes were then approved as read.

Reports officers

The following monthly report of officers was read, Water Supr., City Sealer, City Treasurer, Police Magistrate, the following yearly reports of officers were read, Fire Chief, City Clerk, City Treasurer, and Water Supr. They were all referred to the Committee on Finance.

C.P. McCarty to build shed

Chairman Norris of the Fire and Police Committee reported favorable upon the petition of C.P. McCarty to build a Corrugated iron roof shed on lot 13 Block 125. Alderman Lutes made a motion seconded by Alderman Davies that the report of Committee be accepted and affirmed, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Bldg at 532 Main St. condemned

Chairman Norris of the Fire and Police Committee reported unfavorable upon the petition to condemn the building located at 532 Main St. Thereupon Alderman Davies made a motion seconded by Alderman Lutes that the report of the Committee be accepted and affirmed upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ord. 144 Passed and adopted

Ordinance No. 144, being an Ordinance to amend Section 10 of Ordinance No. 125 being an Ordinance entitled "an Ordinance granting to George Smith, his successors and assigns, the right to construct, maintain and operate a system of street railway and granting the right of way therefor, within the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, and etc." said Ordinance No. 144 was read at length in open Council, the same being the second reading of said Ordinance, thereupon Alderman Lutes made a motion seconded by Alderman Norris that said Ordinance No. 144 be duly passed and adopted, upon call of roll vote was as follows, Alderman Davies yea, Lutes yea, M. C. Culloch yea, Norris yea, Platt yea, Smith yea motion carried.
