The following applications for the position of Police magistrate were read. T. M. Welch and C. B. Hill, Thompson ald. applicants Matthews made a motion seconded by ald. Drew that Council proceed to ballot on the applicants for Police magistrate, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Alderman Matthews made a motion seconded by Ald. Plank that the street Supervisor be instructed to purchase Fifty inches of water for the purpose of irrigating the City Parks and trees along the streets of the City, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ald. Davies introduced the following resolution.

### (Resolution)

Whereas, the City of Grand Junction has an organization known as the Y.M.C.A. association which is organized for the

purpose of raising the moral standard of its citizens and especially the young men of the city and community,

And Whereas, said association will in the near future Resolution erect a building suitable for its purposes, to set apart City Park to y.m.c.a. And Whereas, we the council of this city of Grand Junction, believe that the erection of the said building will mark a new era on 5<sup>th</sup> St. in our history as a city.

And Whereas, we further believe that the location of the said building is extremely pertinent, considering the purposes for which the said building is to be devoted,

And Whereas, it is the desire and wish of this Council that the City aid the said association in every way possible in the erection of the said building.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the City submit a proposition to the said y.m.c.a. association to lease to the said association its park on South 5<sup>th</sup> street in said city located opposite the Park Opera House for a nominal sum and for a period of ninety nine years. Provided, the said association will agree to erect in said Park, their said proposed building, and Provided further that said association will keep the grounds or Park in good condition, it to have and use the same in connection with its said building, but to be open to the public at all times as they are at present.

Ald. Boyer made a motion seconded by Ald. Drew that said resolution be adopted, upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Ira Wood & Jas. Brashear he had given Police Commissions to Ira Wood to serve as Police officer at the Salvation Army barracks and Jas. Brashear to serve at large in the City, both to serve without pay from the City, therupon ald. Davis made a motion seconded by ald. Matthews that the special appointments made by the Mayor be sustained and approved upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.

Rule 2 of Order of business Amended.

Alderman Boyer introduced the following resolution seconded by alderman Hudson, That Rule 2 of the Rules and order of business of the City Council of Grand Jct. Colorado, be amended to read as follows; The City Council shall meet regularly on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each and every month, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M. and at any other time they may in their discretion deem proper. upon call of
