- Bills allowed. Ald. Davies made a motion seconded by ald. Matthews that all the bills as read be allowed and warrants be drawn on Treasurer for same upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
- Lewis & Sallee granted license application for Plumbing license and the bond of Lewis & Sallee and J. M. Sampliner the finance com. approved the bond of J. M. Sampliner for Street Bond approved. Supervisor. Thereupon ald. Davies made a motion seconded by ald. Matthews that the reports of Committees be accepted and approved upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
- Bicycle paths to be removed Alderman Matthews made a motion seconded by ald. Hudson that the City atty be instructed to prepare an Ordinance for the repeal of the Ordinance governing the protection of bicycle paths. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
- Profile on 7<sup>th</sup> St. to be changed City Engineer Omalley reported that the grade as shown on the profile on 7<sup>th</sup> & Belford was off about one foot. ald. Flynn made a motion seconded by ald. Hudson that the City Engineer be given authority to correct the profiles upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
- Sidewalks to be surveyed according to grade Mr. Omalley also reported that making the survey for sidewalks on Colo. ave, between 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Sts that the established grade would make a difference of about ten inches when they strike Downey corner. and asked what action he would take in the matter. ald. Flynn made a motion seconded by ald. Matthews that the City Engineer drive the stakes according to profiles as established until such time as they may be changed. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
- adjourn ald. Davies made a motion to adjourn seconded by ald. Flynn. upon call of motion said motion carried unanimously.
